
Ifunanya Chukwuewuzie's Dáil Speech

5th Year Ifunanya Chukwuewuzie attended the RTÉ Youth Assembly on November 15th. Here is her contribution to the assembly delivered in the Dáil Chamber.

"Good morning, I'm Ifunanya Chukwuewuzie and I'm representing Dublin 8. I would just like to say thank you to all the delegates here who are representing all the different



areas, but I just want to reiterate the point that this movement does not stop here. We are fighting for climate change. And just because we got the opportunity to have this platform and to share our proposals doesn't mean that it ends here. We must continue to push and push until every single proposal on that recommendation is listened to and abided by. Keep spreading your message and keep encouraging people to act for climate change. And for anybody watching, don't give up on climate change. Fight any way you can; come to the protests, make your voices heard, 'cause we need change in terms of climate change."
